



FINAL COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT SESSION: CREATING A NEW VISION FOR THE MAIN STREET/CENTRAL EXPRESSWAY CORRIDOR

The City of Richardson needs your help to create a strategy for redevelopment and revitalization of Main Street and the Central Expressway Corridor—Richardson's original downtown and the major access route to the community, its business areas and neighborhoods.

The City will host a **Final Community Involvement Session** on **Thursday, November 8, 2012,** to discuss the Draft Framework Plan, which will help guide the revitalization of the Corridor. The recommendations in the Plan are based on extensive public input and analysis by city staff and a consulting team. **This is the third of three community meetings planned for this phase of the project and the final opportunity to provide input before the study team presents the plan to the City Plan Commission and City Council in December.**

(The Main Street/Central Expressway study area is approximately 415 acres in size, including the Central Expressway Corridor from generally the southern city limit to Arapaho Road and stretching east to Greenville Avenue/Abrams Road and west to Lindale Lane/Custer Road in some locations, as well as the City's historic downtown and the surrounding area. Both were identified for further study in the 2009 Comprehensive Plan.)
