

Zoning Exhibit

Key Development Standards

- Minimum lot area: 3,600 square feet
- Minimum dwelling unit area: 1,600 square feet
- Maximum lot coverage: 65%
- Density: 7.5 dwelling units per acre (60 maximum)
- Front setback: 10' minimum; 20' minimum for garages
- Side yard: TBD; minimum separation 10'
- Rear setback: 5'
- Height: maximum 40'
- HOA required to maintain streets, perimeter wall, common areas and landscaping





ZF 13-10 Notification Map










ZF 13-10 Aerial Map














VOLKSWAGEN RICHARDSON SCHEMATIC DESIGN PACKAGE

- Chapter 18, Article I, Section 18-5
 - (4.) Jump clocks or digital display devices showing time or temperature may be allowed <u>only by a special</u> <u>permit of the sign control board.</u>

Requested Variance

- * Allow for the sign area of a pole sign to be 108 sq. ft.
- Allow for a digital display to show time and temperature.

Reason for request

- * Architectural elements surrounding an electronic messaging center is more appealing.
- Maximize the visibility of the electronic messaging center.
- * Would like to display public service announcements such as time and temperature.

2010 NEIGHBORHOOD VITALITY PROGRAM

- The 2010 Bond Program allocated \$2,000,000 for Neighborhood Vitality Program projects
- In addition, \$1,000,000 of savings and interest earnings from the 2006 Neighborhood Vitality Program was made available
- Project selection was based on a Calls for Projects in the Fall of 2010 in which 25 neighborhoods submitted more than \$10.7 million in requests
- On January 24, 2011, City Council passed Resolution 11-01 finalizing the project selection process
