HOME INSPECTIONS

The Richardson Fire Department wants to help protect your home from fire. At the resident's request, a representative from the Fire Marshal's Office will come to your home and complete a home inspection **free of charge**. Contact the Fire Marshal's Office at 972-744-5750. Below is a checklist that can help make your home and family safer against fire.

1VIA	Do you keep matches, lighters and candles away from children?		
2.	Do you see that all matches and smoking materials are out before they are disposed of?		
3.	Are there plenty of deep-dish, island type ashtrays in all rooms of the house?		
4.	Is "NO SMOKING IN BED" a rule of the house?		
ELECTRICAL HAZARDS			
1.	Are only qualified electricians allowed to install or extend wiring?		
2.	Are there enough electrical outlets in each room to avoid the need for multiple attachment plugs and long extension cords?		
3.	Do extension cords and appliances carry a UL or other testing label?		
4.	Do you allow any electrical extension cords to pass through doors, under rugs or through walls?		
5.	Do you allow extension cords to be stapled or tacked to parts of the building?		
6.	On the household lighting circuit, are the proper fuses or circuit breakers used?		
HEATING AND COOKING			
1.	Are gas furnace and water heater vents in good condition and vented through the roof?		
2.	Do you have the furnace checked annually and filters changed at least quarterly?		
3.	Are your chimney and fireplace in good repair; no loose mortar or bricks?		
4.	Is the screen on your fireplace opening in den and on chimney above the roof?		
5.	No stored materials around furnace, water heater or stove?		
6.	Do you have a fire extinguisher near the kitchen and know how to use it?		
7.	When portable heaters are used, are they kept away from curtains, furniture and combustibles?		
FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS			
1.	Do you use a UL listed container for gasoline and is it stored away from heating equipment?		
2.	Do you always fill the lawn mower outside the garage when the lawn mower is cool?		
3.	Do you warn all family members to never start fire in a grill or fireplace with flammable liquids?		
STORAGE			
1.	Are closets & attic free from rubbish, oily rags, flammable liquids, stacks of paper and combustibles?		
2.	Do you know it is against the law to burn leaves, grass, or trash?		
3.	Is the alley and yard free of high weeds, grass, and rubbish?		
IN CASE OF FIRE			
1.	Have you discussed and practiced a home fire drill with family members?		
2.	Are your exterior house numbers visible from the street and alley?		
3.	Are babysitters instructed carefully on what to do in case of fire?		
4.	Is the EMERGENCY phone number 911 on or near all phones in the home?
