### **CULTURAL ARTS COMMISSION**

- Serves as an advisory board to the City Council involving the promotion of the arts in Richardson.
- The Commission:
  - Provides a biennial "state of the arts" assessment to the City Council.
  - Makes recommendations to the City Council relative to expenditures of City funds for promoting and sustaining the arts in the City.
  - Serves as a review board for the funding of various arts organizations from allocations through the hotel/motel tax fund.



### ARTS INITIATIVE GRANT

- Funded from annual arts grant program reserves \$26,500
- New or unique opportunities that are not part of an organization's regular season, with special consideration given to:
  - A special performance or series that provides a unique cultural or artistic offering to the community
  - A performance or exhibit that integrates technology and/or interactive components
  - A collaborative art project between multiple organizations
  - An additional community outreach initiative that provides enrichment to Richardson residents
- Equipment relevant to the artists or professional aspect of the organization
- Performances or offerings need to occur within the City of Richardson
- The Arts Initiative Grant request should not exceed 50% of the submitted project budget

  - Celebrate Mother's Day by a children's art competition and art exhibition, combined with Ikebana flower arrangement workshop and exhibition
  - The event will cultivate the younger generation of artists and promote family relationships by working on flower arrangements together
- Amount of Funding Requested: \$3,000
- Amount of Funding Recommended: \$2,500



- Organization: OutLoud
- Concept: See Me Interactive Performance and Exhibition at the Eisemann Center
- When: September October 2024
- What:
  - The "See Me" project is a groundbreaking performance and exhibition that merges theater, art, and technology to amplify the voices of youth in North Texas
  - Utilizing cutting edge technology such as holograms and projections, the project blurs the lines between truth and fiction, inviting audiences to navigate a walkable exhibition of videos, images, and immersive experiences. By amplifying the voices of youth in our community and fostering dialogue about identity, perception, and community engagement, "See Me" aims to spark meaningful conversations and inspire empathy and understanding
- Amount of Funding Requested: \$25,000
- Amount of Funding Recommended: \$10,000



- Organization: Richardson Symphony Orchestra
- Concept: Community Pops Concert at UT Dallas
- When: October 2024
- What:
  - A collaboration between the Richardson Symphony Orchestra and the University of Texas at Dallas for an outdoor concert that will showcase the orchestra through an engaging Pops Concert and will introduce the community to a newly renovated area of the UTD campus
- Amount of Funding Requested: \$15,000
- Amount of Funding Recommended: \$7,000


